Generally speaking, warm colors are higher than cold colors, colors with high brightness and high saturation are higher than colors with low brightness and low saturation, colors with high contrast are higher than those with low contrast, and colors are higher than black, white and gray energy. The exquisite layout of color elements in the film and television images forms the energy foundation of the work, providing the audience with a visual feast. The gradual upgrade of color reproduction in the history of advances in film, television photography and projection technology is a testament to the high importance that people attach to this basic function of color.

Taking "The Legend of Zhen Huan" as an example, Zhen Huan's clothing color gradually changed from the initial light and elegant to gorgeous and complex, which not only intuitively shows the transformation of her external image, but also profoundly reveals the transformation process of her personality from innocence to complexity, and emotion from peaceful to intense. The careful layout of color elements prompts the audience to be closely connected with the emotions of the characters in the process of watching the movie, and resonates, which has become one of the important factors for film and television works to win the recognition and praise of the audience.

3.2 Convey emotions and create an atmosphere

At the end of The French Lieutenant's Woman, Sara is reborn and at peace and ease, her outfit is a bright off-white color with a gentle pink, and the windows of her studio are bright and clear, with beautiful views of the lake and mountains.

3.3 Allusion to the theme

For a long time, colors with different energies and temperaments have been endowed with specific symbolic meanings under the immersion of the cultural environment, reaching a consensus, and passing them on from generation to generation, so creators often use colors to convey specific themes in their works. The French psychologist Fauret once mentioned such an experimental result in his book "On Kinesthetic", that is, under the irradiation of color light, the elasticity of human muscles can be increased, and the blood circulation can be accelerated, and the gradient of increase is "blue is the smallest, and gradually increases in the order of green, yellow, orange, and red" [1], because red can greatly speed up blood circulation compared to other colors, red makes people energetic, so it often symbolizes vitality, rebellion, violence and love. The creator cleverly uses red to express the corresponding theme, such as using red to express the endless vitality of the Chinese people in "Red Sorghum", rebellion in "The Girl in Red", violence in "Pulp Fiction", and love in "American Beauty". In short, although the color is silent, its rich symbolic connotation inspires the viewer to think deeply, and guides the viewer to

explore the deep emotions and philosophical implications behind the picture[2].

4. Conclusion

To sum up, in the vast world of film and television art, the exquisite layout of color elements is a solid foundation for building outstanding works. It not only realistically restores the real world on the screen, producing shocking visual effects, but also profoundly outlines the distinct outline of the characters' personalities, builds a multi-layered emotional atmosphere, refines and sublimates the main idea of the work, and leads the audience into the unique art palace of the work.
