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A Study into the Translation Practical Training in English Teaching at Universities

3.2 Creating an immersive translation situation to deepen the experience

Translation is a practical activity that needs to be carried out in real contexts. Therefore, colleges and universities should create immersive translation contexts so that students can deepen their experience in the actual translation process.

English teachers in colleges and universities can implement project-based teaching to simulate real translation projects for students to participate in, such as business negotiation translation, conference translation, literary work translation, etc., so that students can exercise their translation skills in simulated contexts^[5].

As a first step, it is necessary to create a translation project and clarify the translation task. Teachers can sort out the real translation projects they have participated in the past and make appropriate adjustments.

In the second step, students form a group, elect a project leader, and combine the project requirements under the unified command of the leader to split the translation tasks and collect relevant information.

In the third step, the group goes through project-based translation and discussion, and constantly revises and proofreads the translation results. During this process, the teacher makes a tour to guide the students, solves the difficulties they encounter and pays attention to the process and results of the students' practice.

In the fourth step, after each group finishes correcting and perfecting their translations, they evaluate and proofread each other's translations and integrate them, and finally submit their respective translations to the person in charge.

In the fifth step, the teacher will comment on the translations of each group, from the whole to the part of the detailed comments, and then summarize the project to complete the project.

Through project-based teaching, it can not only provide students with an immersive learning environment, but also cultivate their independent learning ability, teamwork ability and problem solving ability, and achieve the goal of practical translation training.

3.3 Building a scientific practical training resource system with the help of modern technology

With the progress of science and technology, the application of modern technology in the field of education is becoming more and more extensive. Colleges and universities should make full use of modern technology to build a scientific translation practical training resource system, and help students improve the efficiency and quality of translation by constructing an online translation platform, providing a large amount of translation practice materials as well as artificial intelligence-assisted translation tools^[6].

At the same time, colleges and universities can also make use of virtual reality technology to create a simulated working environment, so that students can practice translation in the virtual environment and improve their coping ability. Big data technology is used in this process to analyse the data of students' practice and provide students with personalized translation suggestions and improvement plans.

In addition, colleges and universities need to actively establish a dynamic resource updating mechanism, check the correlation between translation practical training resources and social development from time to time, and constantly update and iterate to ensure the effectiveness and educativeness of the resources, so that students can be effectively connected with social development.

4. Conclusion

To sum up, translation practical training has an important role in English teaching in colleges and universities. In view of the problems existing in the current practical training of translation, we need to optimize the concept, resources and methods in order to improve the quality of English translation teaching in colleges and universities in China and cultivate translators with international competitiveness.
